LATINO CHRONIC DISEASE COHORT



PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

Using a coordinated care approach and evidenced-based assessment tools, ACCESS focuses on delivering intensive wraparound services to individuals in need of multiple services across the County's safety net system which includes health and behavioral health services, economic, workforce, food assistance, education, housing, and other community-based social services and supports that address the social determinants of health (SDOH).

The ACCESS Harris County Latino Chronic Disease Cohort aims to serve Latino adults with chronic diseases (such as hypertension, obesity, cardiovascular disease, and pre-diabetes/diabetes) who may be disengaged from care and/or have multiple social needs.



HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS:

- Participants work with a Case Manager on a one-on-one basis to ensure individual goals are met.
- Participants can enroll in an additional Home Visiting Programs for specialized support.
- Participants will take an active role in managing their chronic disease(s) through the support of their assigned Care Coordination Team.
- Participants will be able to attend chronic disease health education classes.
- Participants will be able to receive support with scheduling and attending medical appointments.

✓ WHO QUALIFIES FOR ACCESS HARRIS COUNTY LATINO CHRONIC DISEASE SUPPORT SERVICES?

- Participant must be over the age of 18
- Live within Harris County
- Have one or more chronic disease, such as hypertension, obesity, lung disease, cardiovascular disease, prediabetes or diabetes
